Recap: PNM media briefing on weather event and Public Safety Power Shutoff in the East Mountains

(Albuquerque, NM) – Today, PNM hosted a virtual media briefing on the extreme wind and weather event forecasted on March 6 in the Santa Fe, East Mountains, and Las Vegas areas which could increase the risk of wildfires and weather-related outages.

PNM stated on this briefing that in order to keep our customers, communities, and employees safe from the threat of wildfire caused by electrical equipment, PNM is implementing a Public Safety Power Shutoff (PSPS) in the East Mountains area at 12 p.m. today, March 6. However, because weather and other factors have shifted, a PSPS is now estimated to be implemented at 1 p.m. today, March 6, unless weather and fire risk conditions improve. PNM will continue to monitor real-time conditions. We are advising customers in the East Mountains to plan for an extended power outage through the night.

A PSPS is not planned for the Santa Fe and Las Vegas areas. However, due to elevated fire risk PNM has changed system settings to not automatically re-energize tripped lines when there is a fault. This would require crews to visually inspect lines for damage before power can be restored, which would result in longer-duration outages.

Weather-related outages may occur throughout the PNM service area. Be prepared for extended, weather-related outages. Please report your outage at <u>PNM.com/outage</u> or by texting #REG to 78766 and then #OUT to 78766.
